BIO

Fonna Forman is Professor of Political Theory at the University of California, San Diego and Founding Director of the [UCSD Center on Global Justice](#), a research center launched in 2010 to advance high-impact, community-based research on poverty, migration, and climate disruption, with a focus on the US–Mexico borderlands. The Center’s core initiative is the [UCSD Community Stations](#) -- a network of neighborhood-based platforms on both sides of the border-wall dedicated to co-developing climate adaptation infrastructure, emergency and social housing, public space, environmental conservancy, and experimental cultural strategies that foster binational civic engagement and collective climate action. Among these projects is *Santuario Frontera*, the largest migrant shelter in the US–Mexico border region and a prototype for integrated humanitarian and ecological resilience infrastructure.

Forman and long-time research partner, architect Teddy Cruz, recently received the [2026 US National Design Award](#) for the UCSD Community Stations—the nation’s highest recognition for design excellence, overseen by the Smithsonian -- in the category of *Climate Action*.

Forman’s research advances bottom-up approaches to climate resilience planning in frontline communities, with particular attention to climate-forced displacement, cross-border ecological governance, and emerging forms of citizenship shaped by shared environmental risks and opportunities. Across her work, she investigates how universities can function as civic partners in advancing equitable climate adaptation and strengthening public capacity for collective action under conditions of accelerating disruption.

Forman is a climate action leader across the University of California system. In recognition of her applied research and institutional leadership, she was appointed in 2021 by UC President Michael Drake to serve as co-chair of the UC Global Climate Leadership Council (GCLC), an executive-level body advising the Office of the President on systemwide climate policy, research, and education. She is the first faculty member to serve in this role.

She also co-chaired the *Climate Resilient California and Californians (CRC2)* summit in 2025, convened in partnership with PAS / PASS and the California Governor’s Office, to accelerate climate resilience planning across cities and counties statewide. She is currently co-authoring a University of California Press volume on CRC2 with Ram Ramanathan and Marcelo Suárez-Orozco. This work reflects a broader research commitment to advancing the MAST framework for resilience (mitigation, adaptation, and societal transformation) particularly for frontline communities experiencing the earliest and most severe impacts of climate disruption.

Since 2017, Forman has contributed to the work of the Pontifical Academies of Sciences and Social Sciences on the ethical and societal dimensions of climate change, migration, and resilience through lectures, publications, and participation in major Vatican convenings on planetary health, humanitarian migration, and climate justice. Her work with the Academies includes contributions to the *Health of People, Health of Planet* initiative, the Global Compact on Education, and several Academy declarations on climate and human well-being, as well as participation in recent resilience summits in California,

Boston and Nairobi. Across these collaborations, her research advances integrated approaches linking climate science, migration ethics, education, and community-based adaptation across regions of the world.

Forman is editor of the *Cities* issue of *Current History* (November 2026), part of the journal's relaunch by the University of California Press. Founded in 1914 as a supplement to *The New York Times*, *Current History* is being reimaged as a venue for globally engaged public writing on urgent contemporary challenges. The issue convenes twenty leading international urbanists, architects, planners, designers, ecologists, artists, and social scientists advancing new paradigms for understanding cities as central sites of climate adaptation and societal transformation.

Forman has contributed to major climate policy reports and initiatives with the Institute for Governance and Sustainable Development, the *Well Under 2 Degrees* initiative, the International Union for Conservation of Nature and the California Collaborative for Climate Change Solutions. She is presently an advisor on California's 5th Climate Change Assessment; and in 2015 she served as vice-chair, with Ramanathan, of the University of California's influential *Bending the Curve* report on climate solutions, carried by Governor Jerry Brown to the COP-21 meetings in Paris.

A leading advocate of climate education as public infrastructure for resilience, Forman serves as faculty PI of [Bending the Curve: Climate Change Solutions](#), a systemwide educational platform used across all ten University of California campuses and adopted by universities and professional institutions nationally and internationally, including the American Medical Association, the One Health Workforce Alliance, the National Education Opportunity Network, and the Los Angeles Unified School District. At UC San Diego she led the committee that established the university's Climate Change Education Requirement in 2023, the first such requirement in California and among the first in the world. She recently published a commentary in [Nature](#) on the importance of localizing climate education.

Forman was trained as an intellectual historian of modern political economy at the University of Chicago and is an internationally recognized scholar of Adam Smith. Her award-winning book *Adam Smith and the Circles of Sympathy* (Cambridge, 2009) helped recover the ethical and public dimensions of Smith's thought and established her as a leading voice in contemporary Smith scholarship. For nearly fifteen years (2012-2025) she served as Editor of the *Adam Smith Review*, the field's leading international academic journal, shaping new directions in the study of moral and political economy. This work continues to inform her research on climate justice, migration, and equitable urban development, where she brings Smith's insights about public goods, collective responsibility, social norms of decency and magnanimity, and the moral foundations of economic life into dialogue with contemporary challenges of displacement and planetary risk.

An experienced institution builder, Forman founded the UCSD Center on Global Justice in 2010 and has raised more than \$26 million in grant funding and philanthropy to support its community-based climate and social-justice initiatives, with support from the Mellon Foundation, the Ford Foundation, the Surdna Foundation, the PARC Foundation, the National Science Foundation, the National Endowment for the Arts, and the California Energy Commission, among others.

She has served on numerous national and international advisory bodies on human rights, climate justice, migration and equitable urbanization. From 2013 to 2017 she was appointed by former British Prime Minister Gordon Brown to the [Global Citizenship Commission](#), a Carnegie-funded initiative advising United Nations policy on human rights in the 21st century. She has spoken twice before UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon and High Commissioner for Human Rights Zeid Ra'ad Al Hussein on human-rights education and global citizenship.

CIVIC AND URBAN RESEARCH + PRACTICE

These are the research-based civic and urban projects of Fonna Forman and Teddy Cruz. The first section includes ongoing research initiatives, including public visualization and cartographical projects. The second section, public programs curated in partnership with cultural producers (in visual arts, music, literature, theatre and dance). The third, spatial interventions – public space, housing, green infrastructure – designed, funded, built and programmed with community-based organizations, cultural institutions and public agencies. All the projects below engage broad and diverse publics and civic actors through multiple mediums and strategies of communication, locally and across the world, including academic and non-academic publication, consultancy, cultural exhibition, media engagement, public and academic lectures, studios and masterclasses.

Research Initiatives

MEXUS: Geographies of Interdependence, 2018-current

An iterative research-visualization project that investigates the collisions between natural and political systems along the entire continental border between the US and Mexico, and imagines a new cross-border zone of interdependence -- a thick, bioregional set of social-ecologies framed by shared binational watersheds systems. First exhibited in 2018 in the U.S. Pavillion at the Venice Architecture Biennale.

Cross-Border Commons, 2018-current

A bioregional research and land-conservancy initiative to protect the Tijuana River National Estuary in San Diego from northward run-off and sediment descending from the informal settlements of the Laureles Canyon in Tijuana. The project protects un-squatted lands in the settlement, and creates a continuous political, social and ecological zone with the Estuary on the US side. Partners include researchers, government agencies and grassroots organizations on both sides of the border.

Prouvé in Tijuana, 2017-current

A research initiative on post-war French architect Jean Prouvé, renowned for prefabricated social housing and public infrastructure. Three prototypes of his *Maison Tropicale* in Africa were salvaged by NYC-based philanthropist Robert Rubin, who donated one to the Pompidou (Paris); one to the Museum of Modern Art (New York); and one to the UCSD Center on Global Justice to recuperate Prouvé's public legacy in a site of need. Prouvé's modular and incrementalist logics inspire our spatial practice, and the donated parts are incorporated into the schematic design of the Meson del Pueblo in the Alacrán Canyon, Tijuana.

Mecalux Retrofit, 2015-current

A social housing research collaboration with Mecalux Mexico, a Spanish maquiladora based in Tijuana who have agreed to adapt their material systems into new structural frameworks for emergency housing in the settlements of Tijuana. Mecalux regularly subsidizes materials for our Tijuana-based construction projects.

The Political Equator, 2012-current

An iterative research-visualization project that links border conditions across the globe, between the 30th-38th parallels north.

The Medellín Diagram, 2012-9

An iterative public diagramming project that visualizes the transformative political and civic dynamics of Medellín, Colombia during the administration of Mayor Sergio Fajardo. In collaboration with Alejandro Echeverri and Matthias Görlich. First exhibited in 2014 at the UN-Habitat World Urban Forum in Medellín, Colombia.

The Cross-Border Citizen, 2012-7

A *Bi-national Citizenship Culture Survey* initiative in partnership with Bogotá Mayor Antanas Mockus and the Bogotá-based NGO, Corpovisionarios. A partnership with the municipalities of San Diego and Tijuana. Funded by the Ford Foundation and the San Diego Foundation.

Public / Cultural Programming

Weather Station at the UCSD-EarthLab, 2024-current

A partnership with the NSF-funded *Heat Hub*, based at UCSD's Scripps Institution of Oceanography, to make locally-relevant weather data available to students, community members, and scientists.

Refugee Writing Residency, 2024-current

A partnership with the international organization I-CORN that brings refugee writers to the UCSD Community Stations sites to curate community programming, oriented around literary production.

UCSD-Casa Collaboratories, 2022-current

The CSA Co-LABs are 5-year an arts and culture collaboration, funded by the Mellon Foundation, that culminates each year in a highly visible performance or exhibition at the UCSD-Casa Community Station.

Programming focuses on eco-social challenges facing the community of San Ysidro. A partnership with Robert Castro, UCSD Professor of Theater and Dance; Nydia Pineda de Ávila, UCSD Assistant Professor of History and Philippe Olle Laprune, Director of *Casa Refugio*.

FRONTeras, 2022-current

A four-year music program, funded by the Mellon Foundation, that brings established international musicians and composers together with San Ysidro-based artists and youth to engage in interpretative conversations, workshops and music-led dialogues that culminate in a public performance by participating musicians, students and community members at the UCSD-Casa Community Station. A partnership with Steven Schick, UCSD Distinguished Professor of Music; and Wilfrido Terraza, UCSD Professor of Music.

Public Scholars, 2012-current

Universities benefit from the knowledge, social capital, spaces and time of community partners, and are ethically responsible for recognizing these contributions. Rooted in a commitment to epistemic justice and labor equity, we launched the Public Scholars program in 2012 to enable community leaders in the San Diego-Tijuana region to partner with UCSD researchers, helping to frame and prioritize challenges and orient educational and research agendas.

Border Health Clinic, 2021-2024

Planning efforts for a three-room health clinic inside the *Santuario Frontera* migrant housing project. A partnership with the UCSD School of Medicine and the UABC School of Medicine.

Little Amal at the San Diego-Tijuana Border, November 4-7, 2023

Partnership with the UCSD Department of Theatre and Dance and the Friends of Friendship Park to host 10ft. puppet at three sites on both sides of the border: the UCSD-Casa Community Station; the UCSD-Alacrán Community Station; and at the border wall at Playas, Tijuana.

Spatial Interventions (Public Space, Social Housing, Green Infrastructure)

Renewable Mass Timber for Migrant Housing, 2023-

A project in collaboration with UCSD Department of Structural Engineering to recycle a mass timber building, assembled for testing on the UCSD shake-table, for reuse as structural materials for migrant housing in the UCSD-Alacrán Community Station.

EarthLab Climate Action Design Center / STEM Building, 2020-current

Schematic design of a 4,000 sq. ft STEM design lab building, commissioned by the San Diego Unified School District. Will break ground 2024.

Meson del Pueblo, 2022-current

6,000 sq. ft two-story industrial kitchen, multi-purpose dining space and food justice incubator in the UCSD-Alacrán Community Station, to support the *Santuario Frontera* migrant housing project in the informal settlement of Alacrán Canyon, Tijuana. Broke ground June 2022.

Cancha Frontera, 2022-2023

A 3,000 sq. ft. multi-purpose sport court for formal and informal basketball and soccer programming at the UCSD-Alacrán Community Station. Completed March 2023.

Santuario Frontera Housing Project, Tijuana, 2018-current

Home of the UCSD-Alacrán Community Station, a three story, 16,000 sq. ft. mixed-use emergency housing project under construction in the informal settlement of Alacrán Canyon, Tijuana to house 350 migrant residents. The project includes spaces for social service, educational and cultural programming, small-scale economic incubators, a fabrication workshop, a nursery and an industrial kitchen. Broke ground February 2020.

Parque Miramar, 2018-current

A public green-space restoration project in the informal settlement of Laureles Canyon, Tijuana, at the site of a 2015 landslide. The 2-acre project is both reparative and pedagogic, modeling treatment of sloping surfaces and reducing landslide risk with native vegetation and sustainable materials. A collaboration with Proyecto Fronterizo de Educación Ambiental, LandLAB and Instituto Metropolitano de Planeación, Tijuana. Funded by Fundación Rio Arronte. Site clean-up underway (“Community Trash Brigades”). Broke ground early 2022.

UCSD-Divina Community Station building, 2016-current

Schematic design for a 24,000 sq. ft. mixed-use structure, to house the UCSD-DIVINA Community Station. Plans include diverse economic and cultural programs, and the first high school in the Laureles Canyon of Tijuana.

EarthLab Climate Action Park, 2016-current

Home of the UCSD-EarthLab Community Station, a 4-acre educational park in collaboration with the San Diego Unified School District. Participatory Masterplan upgrade schematic design process underway.

The UCSD Community Stations, 2010-current

A network of four field stations located in low-income neighborhoods on both sides of the San Diego-Tijuana border, where researchers, students and community-based agencies partner on research, teaching, cultural activity and urban intervention. Programmed to engage community-defined challenges, each station is designed, funded, built and programmed collaboratively between campus and community. Moving from north to south:

UCSD-EarthLab Community Station, located in the Southeast San Diego neighborhood of Encanto, in collaboration with the non-profit Groundwork San Diego.

UCSD-CASA Community Station located in the border neighborhood of San Ysidro, California, in collaboration with the non-profit Casa Familiar.

UCSD-Alacrán Community Station, located in the informal settlement of Alacrán canyon, in collaboration with the faith-based organization, Embajadores de Jesus – Little Haiti.

UCSD-Divina Community Station, located in the informal settlement of Divina Providencia in the Laureles Canyon of Tijuana, in collaboration with the A.C. Colonos de la Divina Providencia.

Living Rooms at the Border, 2012-2020

Home of the UCSD-CASA Community Station, a \$9M, 15,000 sq. ft. mixed-use housing development in partnership with the non-profit Casa Familiar, funded by the PARC Foundation, ArtPlace America and others. Completed construction in February 2020.

EPIC: The Chollas Eco-Village, 2016-8
